About Judith Snow

Judith Snow, MA is a social inventor and an advocate for Inclusion – communities that welcome the participation of a wide diversity of people. She is also a visual artist and Founding Director of Laser Eagles, an organization making creative activity available through personal assistance to artists with diverse ability, www.lasereagles.org.

An exhibition of 23 of Judith Snow's paintings is currently on at the Royal Ontario Museum, just extended until July 2012. The focus of the exhibit, "Who's Drawing the Lines," is on the value of art facilitation and on her journey of discovering Inclusion.

Judith consults and does workshops on peace and inclusion, person centred planning, personal assistance, support circle building, family support and inclusive education. Her goal is to foster an understanding of how people with disabilities can be full participants in communities everywhere.

Judith Snow does this work out of a background of being labeled disabled herself. Among other achievements she lived in a chronic care environment for four years and, with the assistance of a strong support circle, became the first person in Canada to receive government mandated individualized funding for personal assistance.

Stephanie Benn (Alexandra Molitovsky) is a local teacher, who spends her off-time looking for any excuse to sing. She is especially fond of the notions that singing can move us in unexpected ways and that the way we treat each other is a political statement while all the rest – just elaboration.

Carrie Hoskins (Esme Alter) ... by day Carrie is a civil servant and the rest of the time she is a dancer, horsewoman and lumberjack(eline?), among other things. Diversity is the "thing".



TENORS

Holly Bennett (Kelly Morton) is an editor, writer and author of young adult fantasy novels. She has previously sung with the Convivio Chorus and the Coventry Singers, but this is her first play since grade 6. She still remembers her one line: "Je suis le plus gros tigre de la foret."

John Hoffman (*Jack Braun*) is a freelance writer, musician and father of three. He writes about parenting, child development and health and spends as much time as possible playing Irish music on the fiddle.
