# Artist biographies

Founded in 1993. The Holy Body Tattoo seeks a performance language which gathers a sense of humanity through effort, repetition, scale and humility. Co-artistic directors and choreographers Noam Gagnon and Dana Gingras have performed independently for many of Canada's leading choreographers and have danced together since 1987. The multi-media performance work of The Holy Body Tattoo often explores the nature of human endurance through ideas of surrender, fragility and broken elegance. The company reflects upon (and reflects outwardly) the concerns, ideas and attitudes of contemporary popular culture, locating a sense of conscience and hope through intense physicality and deeply sought courage. The Holy Body Tattoo has received both critical and audience acclaim with performances in Canada, U.S. and Europe. our brief eternity captured nominations in both dance categories of The Dora Mayor Moore Awards in 1997. winning Best Ensemble Performance. The film version of Poetry & Apocalypse has been screened in over 16 different international film festivals, winning several awards. Circa, which received the inaugural Alcan Performing Arts Award, has been performed over 100 times around the world, including at Ein Fest in Wuppertal in Germany at the invitation of Pina Bausch, and at London's Barbican Theatre. Cine Qua Non's film version of Circa will soon enjoy its premiere broadcast on Bravo! Television.

The Holy Body Tattoo is currently in creation for monumental, a new full-length work which involves the company's largest performing ensemble to date. monumental is a co-production with the National Arts Centre - CGI Youth Commission for Dance, a partnership with the Canada Council for the Arts. monumental will premiere in Ottawa at the National Arts Centre in February 2005, and tour to Montreal, Edmonton, Victoria and Vancouver in March and April.

Originally from Ontario, Day Helesic acquired a BFA in dance from York University, and went on to train at The School of The Toronto Dance Theatre. In 1997 she moved to Montréal, where she danced for three seasons with Hélène Blackburn, touring internationally. Now based in Vancouver, Day has worked with many choreographers including Lola MacLaughlin, Wen Wei Wang, Crystal Pite and The Holy Body Tattoo. Co-Artistic Producer of MovEnt, Day

has choreographed a number of works for the company as well as produced eight installments of the MovEnt series *Dances for a Small Stage*.

Blair Neufeld has a BA in drama from the University of Alberta and completed his formal dance training at Grant MacEwan College in Edmonton, where he also danced with the Brian Webb Dance Company. Blair has performed in many theatrical productions, made television commercials and has appearanced in the films Shumman and The Book of Eve. From 1989 until 1995, he was a member of Le Groupe Dance Lab in Ottawa where he danced with choreographers such as Louise Bédard, Meg Stewart, Ruth Cansfield, Sylvain Émard, and Tedd Robinson. As an independent dancer in Montréal he has worked with Jean-Pierre Perreault, Hélène Blackburn, Yvonne Coutts, Andrew Harwood and Tassy Teekman. He is presently working with The Holy Body Tattoo on monumental, and is a member of Sylvain Émard Danse in Montreal, with whom he has danced for the past nine years and toured internationally.

Sharon DiGenova began her career in a Broadway touring house in Falmouth, Massachusetts in 1981 - a season which housed nine Broadway tours including Tony award winners Ain't Misbehavin', Children of a Lesser God and Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. Since that time, she has toured internationally (over 300 cities in more than 30 countries) lighting, technical directing, and/or stage managing for companies which include The Royal Winnipeg Ballet, Ronnie Burkett Theatre of Marionettes, Desrosiers Dance Theatre, and since 1997, she has been resident lighting/technical director and stage manager of The Holy Body Tattoo. In 1993 Sharon co-founded Damn Straight (performance studio in Toronto) with Eryn Dace Trudell; together they produced and presented dance companies, workshops, and classes until 1998. Critics have called Sharon's lighting designs "wonderful," "superb," "atmospheric" and "filmic."

D-Anne Kuby Trépanier's first working experience with Dana and Noam was in 1995 in their work Situations of Desire. They dressed her up in high heels, a party dress and a platinum blond wig. A few audience members mistook her for Noam in drag. It gives her immense pleasure to take on the role of

rehearsal director for *Running Wild* in which her quarter of a century of dance experience has come in very handy.

Roger Tellier-Craig is a Montreal-based sound reorganizer and/or musician desperately absorbing, shredding and reinterpreting bits and pieces of music iconography. A self-taught filter. He is a member of the groups Et Sans, Fly Pan Am and Set Fire To Flames.

Since leaving SFU in 1986, Jeff Corness has written over 75 compositions for dance, theatre, film and the concert stage, including 14 scores and two operas with Karen Jamieson Dance Company (where he was composer-in-residence from 1988-1995). With subsequent interdisciplinary collaborations, particularly those with British company Foursight Theatre, and Phatravadi Theatre in Bangkok, Thailand, he has cultivated an interest in extending the dialogue between theatre and music. In an attempt to address changes that redefined his life following a near-fatal car accident in 1995, Jeff is working on a new opera; scenes from The Book of Jonah were presented as part of the New Playwrights Workshop in 1999. Max and Moritz, an opera for children written with Michael Turner, was produced by Modern Baroque Opera and performed at the 2003 Vancouver Children's Festival.

Formed in Nottingham, England, in 1992, Tindersticks combines dark romanticism, gentle melancholy, and suggestions of an elegant and intimate debauchery. Known for their signature gutter ballads, the group's music creates an atmosphere of late-night disenchantment matched by haunting melodies and beautiful instrumentation. The sextet includes Stuart Staples (vocals), Dickon Hinchliffe (violin) Dave Boulter (keyboards), Neil Fraser (guitar), Mark Colwill (bass) and Al McCauley (drums), but the band is sometimes augmented with full string and horn sections. Over their more than a decade together, they have produced six studio albums, soundtracks to several films and various other projects, and have attracted rave reviews.




