

Mandiani is a celebration dance, while Doundounba is a dance of strength; both dances are from Guinea, West Africa and are from the Djembe family of dances.









#### CHOREOGRAPHERS BIOS

ROBIN HIBBERT, the dance director of Xalat West African Drum and Dance, was born and raised in Brooklyn, N.Y. Her background includes training and performances in Dunham and Graham techniques, as well as various schools including the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre and Dance Theatre of Harlem. Presently Robin teaches at Miss Barbara's School of Dance (traditional West Africa) and Buffalo State College. In addition to her work in dance, she is a teacher for the Buffalo Head Start Program.

EDDISON B. LINDSAY was born in Trinidad and for the past 17 years has filled the roles of dancer, choreographer, singer, musician, costume designer/maker and father. He trained at the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, at the School of Toronto Dance Theatre, with various Caribbean and African teachers, and holds a craftsman diploma in style and design. Co-founder of COBA, for whom he has created numerous works, he has also danced and choreographed for the National Dance Company of Trinidad and Tobago and Les Enfants Dance Co (T&T). A member of Danny Grossman Dance Company, Eddison was also in the original Canadian cast of Disney's The Lion King in Toronto. Eddison's mission with his choreographic recreations of traditional works is to clarify the confusion that is "FUSION" in COBA's home city, Toronto. Though his feet have been on many paths, Eddison strives to identify each path as its own journey.

JULIA MORRIS is from the "Land of Wood and Water", better known as Jamaica. She trained at the Jamaica School of Dance and was a company member of L'acadco (L'antoinette's American, Caribbean, African Dance Company) for four years, during which she toured Europe, Cuba and Mexico. In addition to her work as a choreographer and dancer, Julia is also a costume and set designer.


