

CHARLES LINEHAN COMPANY has received commissions from The Royal Festival Hall, Dance Umbrella and The Place Theatre, along with international commissions supported by The British Council.

Since 2003 the company has toured extensively throughout Europe performing in festivals in London, Paris, Brussels, Helsinki, Munich and Thessaloniki, as well as Moscow, Bucharest, Prague and Thallinn. This is their first North American Tour.

The company values originality and innovation, absence of clutter, and the dancers. beyond their technical excellence, for their creativity and individual human qualities.

Company Members & Collaborators

Charles Linehan - Artistic Director Charles Linehan trained at the Rambert Academy before going on to work with contemporary companies throughout Europe, returning to the UK in 1994 to establish his own company. He was Choreographer-in-Residence at The Place Theatre from 1996-1998 and won The Jerwood Award for Choreography 1998-1999 as well as winning awards from The Paul Hamlyn Foundation, The Robin Howard Foundation and The Rodin Fund.

Julian Swales - Composer

Has composed for television, theatre and dance. As a member of bands signed to A&M and One Little Indian he produced four albums and toured Europe and the US. He has since composed music for several TV documentaries. including Geisha, a BBC series Mountain Men, a production on space accidents and is currently working on a BBC documentary on obsession. He has worked with Ann MacKnim at the Crucible Theatre, Sheffield. He has worked with Charles Linehan on four productions including The Order of Things, Truly Great Thing (for George Piper Dances), Speak, memory and Grand Junction.

Mikki Kunttu - Lighting Designer Mikki Kunttu (1971) graduated from Tampere Polytechnic School of Art and Media in 1995. Kunttu has worked with choreographers Carolyn Carlson, Tero Saarinen, Jorma Uotinen, Lionel Hoche and Charles Linehan among others. Mikki Kunttu has created lighting designs for Lyon Opera Ballet, Geneve Ballet, Finnish National Ballet, The Royal Danish Ballet, Gothenburg Opera Ballet, Batsheva Dance Company and Ballet Gulbenkian. His works include lighting and stage designs for contemporary dance, classical ballet, opera, television, film, art exhibition and concert productions. Mikki Kunttu has been a freelancer since 1998.

Karsten Tinnap - Technical Director
Karsten Tinapp (Lighting Designer) is Production
Manager for Charles Linehan Company and also
works for Laban, London as Production Manager.
Lighting designs include *Truly Great Thing* for
Charles Linehan, performed by The Ballet Boyz.
He worked as a freelance Production Manager
for companies such as The Cholmondeleys & The
Featherstonehaughs, Rosemary Butcher, Robert
Wilson, Sasha Waltz & Guests and has worked on
projects for Merce Cunnigham Company in Berlin
(Germany) and London (UK).

Greig Cooke - Dancer (Grand Junction & New Quartet)

Trained at London Contemporary Dance School and performed with their post-graduate company 4D and obtained a BA (hons) in contemporary dance and choreography, as well as a Master of Arts in Dance for the Screen. He has worked with Aletta Collins, Adventures in Motion Pictures, Richard Alston Dance Company and The Featherstonehaughs. He first worked with Charles Linehan in 1996 for a Royal Festival Hall commission with the band Ulramarine. He also created roles and performed in Number Stations, 1999, Preludes and Fugues, 1999 (Jerwood Award), The Order of Things, 2000 and Speak, memory 2001.

He has been involved in teaching Charles Linehan Company workshops and Masterclasses in England and abroad.

Andreja Rauch - Dancer (Grand Junction & New Quartet)

Trained at London Contemporary School of Dance, obtaining a BA (hons) in contemporary dance and choreography, and then a Master of Arts in Dance for the Screen, she also attended the California Institute of the Arts. She continues to work with choreographer Iztok Kovacas' En-Knap dance Company. Andreja choreographed and directed the performance Tipke, with music by John Sweeney, which premiered in May 2001 in Maribor. She has danced for Charles Linehan in Duet (2000), and Speak, memory (2001).

Ben Ash - Dancer (New Quartet)

Trained at Arts Educational London and the Rambert School. He has worked and toured with Richard Alston Dance Company, Mark Baldwin, Siobhaun Davies Dance Company, Random Dance Company, Javier De Frutos & Essac Julien, Companhia de Bailado Contemporaneo Potuguesa and Henri Oguike. He has worked very closely with Charles Linehan since 1995 performing in many company works including amongst others Preludes & Fugues, The Order of Things, as well as new work. He teaches company classes in London and internationally as well as choreographing his own work.

Rahel Vonmoos - Dancer (New Quartet) Graduated from London Contemporary Dance School and has since danced with many choreographers including Rosemary Butcher in SCAN (2000), MOLTENI in Zurich, Philippe Gehmacher, Carol Brown, Philippe Saire, Iztok Kovac (film on improvisation) and has participated in several collaborative projects with company Pool (Switzerland). Rahel also choreographs and dances her own work which she has performed in UK. Switzerland and France, A Shadow of Itself was shown at Evolution in 2002. She has worked with Charles Linehan Company since it was founded. Rahel is a committed independent teacher. leading release based classes which explore movement qualities of different body systems and martial arts. In 1998 she certified as a Body-Mind Centering Practitioner in USA.





reg e. gaines, a resident of New York City, co-founder of Scratch DJ Academy, and two time Tony Award and Grammy nominated poet for Bring in da Noise/Bring in da Funk, helps poets bridge the gap between contemporary poetry and the dramatic arts. Workshop participants bring poetry, to be read aloud, which will then be recreated into poetic collages and dramatic monologues. Intense discussions of solid theatre components such as Recurring Themes, Reprise and Character Development are synthesized with poetic devices such as Sound Symbolism, Imagery, Rhythm and Rhyme. This helps to create a new and vibrant form of theatre which is poetry based, rich in metaphor, and moves well beyond its literal meaning.
