A woman who has so carefully organized her life and classified everyone else's, she has managed only to trap herself in her own box.

Every bar has a flower lady. She watches, witnessing the intimacies of others, never having any of her own.

ARTISTS' BIOGRAPHIES

Dara da Costa (dancer) graduated from the Professional Performance Training Program in Modern Dance at The School of Dance in collaboration with Le Groupe Dance Lab in 1998. She has performed in The Canada Dance Festival in Allen Kaeja's <u>Fiftyne</u>; in Toronto's *fringe Festival of Independent Dance Artists* in <u>Soul Survivors</u> with Screaming Kettle Dance Productions, as well as in productions at the National Arts Centre, the National Gallery, and the Museum of Civilization. Both as a student and professionally, Dara has had the opportunity to work with such choreographers as Julia Aplin, Susie Burpee, Yvonne Coutts, Sylvie Desrosiers, Angela Jackson, Meagan O'Shea, Harold Rheaume and Tedd Senmon Robinson.

Alisa Michelle(dancer) is a twenty-five year old scholarship graduate of the School of Toronto Dance Theatre. She has had the pleasure of performing in *FFIDA*, Dances for a Small Stage, and in Bill Coleman's Freak Show. Alisa has presented her own work at Silicone Solutions and Filter, and is continuing to focus on collaborations with artists working in other mediums.

Andrew Morphew (dancer) is happy to be performing in his first professional dance production. An Ottawa based actor, his primary training is in physical theatre, particularly clowning. He graduated from the Dell'Arte School of Physical Theatre in Blue Lake, California, Since then Andrew has worked with Ottawa companies such as Odyssey Theatre, Company of Fools, Theatre Chicks and Counternotes Theatre Group.

Jean Neveu (dancer) attended Ryerson Polytechnical Institute In the Dance and Theatre programme studying ballet, modern and jazz, performing in choreographies by Danny Grossman and Timothy Spain. Returning to Ottawa Jean has continued his training with Peter Boneham at Le Groupe Dance Lab, Jean has performed in pieces choreographed by Yvonne Coutts, Love To Forget (1998); Anik Bouvrette, Hovering Over Me in Canada Dance Festival 1998; his own work, Craintif (1998) at Momentum and Raisonnance for Dance Advance 1999, and Canada Dance Festival 2000.

Caroline Niklas - Gordon (dancer) was born in Kutna Hora, Czechoslovakla, but grew up dancing in St. John's, Newfoundland where she trained with her mother Nicole Nogaret, former Prima balletina with numerous European companies. Her summer months were spent training at Briansky Dance Center, Simon Fraser University, Toronto Dance Theatre, The School of Dance in Ottawa, Quinte Ballet on Belleville. At eighteen Caroline embarked on her professional career as an apprentice with The National Ballet of Prague. In 1992, she returned to St. John's where she began teaching, choreographing and working alongside local artists such as Anne Troake, Louise Moyes, Alison Carter, Tristan Rehner, Jennifer Lynn Dick and Sarah Stoker. Caroline now resides in Toronto where she has Joined the ranks of the independent dance community.

Meagan O'Shea (choreographer) is an independent dance artist, who often combines physical language and prosaic text to create a kinetic performance art fusion of non-linear narratives. In 1998 she was invited to Edinburgh to develop a solo, ...this is The Way which has since been presented at fFIDA 1999, Calculated Risks, with Kate Alton's Overall Dance in Ottawa as part of Dancing Across Ontario, and as a group piece with InMotion Dance Company at the Winchester Street Theatre, 2000. This spring her trio, 3 of a Feather will be performed at the Guelph Contemporary Dance Festival by the youth company YMI Dancing Inc.

Kate Story (dancer) is a Peterborough-based performer and writer. She has created several dance/theatre pieces on her own body, most recently <u>Crazy...Crazy Like a Fish</u> which performed in Peterborough's <u>Emergency</u> festival of new dance, and went on to success at the St. John's Fringe Festival; and <u>Swallowed</u>, which received critical acclaim in St. John's and at the 1998 <u>fringe Festival of Independent Dance Artists in Toronto.</u> She has choreographed for and performed as a dance/theatre artist for several theatre companies, among them: 4th Line Theatre at Riverbanks Productions, Nightwood Theatre, DNA Theatre, and Caravan Stage Company.
