Founded in 1997, **CORPUS** is a fresh company devoted to creating original work for diverse audiences. Known for its precise and surrealist humour, the company combines contemporary dance and physical theatre. Led by Sylvie Bouchard and David Danzon, CORPUS has toured extensively in Ontario and across Canada. In 2001, CORPUS represented Canada in the Street Theatre competition at the IV Games of La Francophonie in Hull, Quebec and won the gold medal with their hit *A Flock of Flyers*. In March 2002, the company completed its first international tour to the Bénin International Theatre Festival, West Africa. CORPUS was the recipient of the 2002 Prix Hommage for Arts awarded by the Féderation Culturelle Canadienne Française. CORPUS also produces the popular summer dance festival, Dusk Dances.



CO-DIRECTORS

Sylvie Bouchard is co-artistic director of CORPUS with David Danzon. She has performed nationally and internationally with Kaeja d'Dance, Winnipeg Contemporary Dancers, Dancemakers, Toronto Dance Theatre, the Houston Grand Opera and the Vancouver Opera. She has worked with many independent choreographers including Roger Sinha, Katherine Labelle, Howard Richard, Cornelius Fisher-Credo and Learie McNicolls. Ms. Bouchard won a Dora Mayor Moore Award nomination for best performance for Cassiopeia (choreographers: Peggy Baker, Serge Bennathan, Roger Sinha and Karen Kaeja). Ms Bouchard's choreography has been seen in Toronto in DUSK DANCES, Human Lingo series, Spring Rites, Older and Reckless, Dances for a Small Stage, and at the du Maurier Theatre; in Montréal at Tangente; and in Winnipeg in a cocreation for Winnipeg Contemporary Dancers. Since forming CORPUS in 1997, Ms. Bouchard has co-created six works with David Danzon and together they produce and curate DUSK DANCES, an annual sitespecific dance event in Toronto, Ottawa and Vancouver.

Born in France, **David Danzon** graduated from the York University Acting program (B.F.A) in 1992 and is currently co-artistic Director of CORPUS. In theatre, he appeared in such diverse roles as: Yepikhodov in *The Cherry Orchard* (Theatre Colombus/Canadian Stage); Virgil in *Dante's Inferno* (Theatre Smith Gilmour/Factory Theatre); Cléante in *Le Malade Imaginaire* (Theatre Smith-Gilmour/TfT), Mereia and Cassius in Caligula (WorldStage), and the father in *Beauty and the Beast* (Jokerman Theatre). In dance, with artistic partner Sylvie Bouchard, he has choreographed and performed in *The Balancing Act, A Flock of Flyers, Carousel, Rendez-vous, Feet in the Air, Head on the Ground!, Bridge of Sighs* and *Nuit blanche*. He also performed in Serge Bennathan's *Few Thousand Miles*. David has written and starred in two children's TV series for TVO: Les Voyages Electroniques de Numérique and Mission: Action (53 episodes). He studied clown and mask with master teacher Phillipe Gaulier, and with Dean Gilmour and John Turner.

ENSEMBLE

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Piotr Biernat, originally from Poland, moved to Canada in 1996 after completing his Master of Fine Arts in acting and directing at the Theatre University in Poland. Piotr likes to explore theatre in many forms; as a dancer, actor, singer and writer. He began training in contemporary dance with Anna Wyman in Vancouver, Main Dance Studio and the School of Toronto Dance Theatre. He has performed in works by Kaeja d'Dance, Kathleen Rea and the Chimera Project, and is currently working with CORPUS as a guest artist on its new work, *Nuit blanche*.

Keiko Ninomiya is originally from Japan. She traveled to England where she studied at the London Studio Centre and the London Contemporary Dance School. Keiko then came to Toronto, Canada where she graduated from The School of Toronto Dance Theater. Keiko has been showcasing her choreography in fFIDA with her *yuragi* project. Currently she works with CORPUS and D. I. X. (Dance Initiative Xtreme) as a co-founder. In previous years, she has performed with Massimo Agostinelli, Patricia Betty, Sharon Moore, Naoko Murakoshi, Jessica Runge, Eryn Dace Trudell and William Yong Dance Company, also BRAVO! film Ethereal Suits by Dante entertainment and Almada Dance Festival in Portugal with D. I. X. Company.

A native Haligonian, Lisa Phinney completed a BSc at Dalhousie University and trained at Halifax Dance, where she performed with the school's Young Company, before moving to Toronto to attend the School of Toronto Dance Theatre's professional program. She has since studied with several artists and has had the pleasure of performing the works of several choreographers in Halifax and Toronto, including David Earle, Leica Hardy, Andrea Leigh Smith, Veronique MacKenzie-Bourne, Sharon Moore, Gwen Noah, Crystal Pite and Michael Trent. She has performed in two Bravo! videos and co-choreographed and performed in the East Coast Music Awards in 1998. In April 2002, Lisa toured with Kaeja d'Dance as part of the KdD2 project, performing Allen Kaeja's Resistance. Recently, Lisa co-founded Mocean, Halifax's new modern dance company, and is excited to bring to fruition the idea of a company in her hometown. She is thrilled to be a part of CORPUS for the creation and production of Nuit

Anand Rajaram is an actor, writer, director, producer, puppeteer, artistic director for King Rudolph Players Theatre Co., co-artistic director for Toast & Jam Puppet Improv, and former co-artistic director and co-founder of MAYA-South Asian Theatre Co. He has a B.A in Drama and Theatre Arts from the University of Waterloo. His theatre credits include work with CanStage, YPT, and Carousel Players, among others. He was a member of the Second City National Touring Co., and with CORPUS Dance Projects, he was a gold medallist in Street Theatre at the 4th International Francophonie Games and performed at the recent Festival International de Theatre (FITHEB) in Benin, West Africa.

Film credits include Mira Nair's My Own Country and independent films Death Threat and Fly, both of which screened at the Toronto International Film Festival and on CBC's Canadian Reflections. Television credits include Blue Murder, Earth: Final Conflict and Relic Hunter. He was the animatronic puppeteer and voice for SNIT on YTV's Snit Station. He is currently playwright-in-residence with VideoCabaret, developing his first play, HYS UNAUTHORYZED LYFE & TYMES and his one-person clown show, Cowboys & Indians. Nuit blanche marks his first time involved so collectively and collaboratively in a project's creation. Due to this and to a very imaginative and creative cast, it has been one of his most inspiring and enriching experiences in performance.

Christopher Sawchyn has studied theatre, clown, dance, mask, film, voice and piano. CORPUS' A Flock of Flyers has taken Christopher to a gold medal win at the IVth Games of la Francophonie and to the International Theatre Festival of Bénin, West Africa. A former member/creator for Canadia dell'Arte, he recently appeared as Polonius in Hamlet for the Old Castle Theatre Company. His career highlights include The Hobbit at The Globe Theatre in Regina with Mike Kennard (Mump'n'Smoot), A Darkling Plain at The Theatre Centre with Hugo Dann and Balm and Gilead as "Dopey" with David Ferry. Stay tuned for the second installment The Boxcar Siding with the Algoma Project at Buddies in Bad Times Theatre, Toronto, in December 2002.

Geoffrey Bouckley has been designing and managing theatre and dance in Canada for several years now with many diverse companies: Romeo and Juliet: Remixed (Spark Productions) Eye Spy (Bunnies in the Headlights Theatre), The Exit Room (Theatre Gargantua), Romeo and Juliet (The MODD Project), Survival U and High Life (Expect Theatre), The Big Picture (Brookstone Performing Arts), Older and Reckless (MoOnhORsE Dance), and of course, the break... They continued with CBC's Witness-Between Here and Heaven; CTV's- Skating Through the Sand; CITY TV's- Fresh Paint-Birth of a Franchise and Birth of a Team; and most recently his music can be heard accompanying Abbott's documentaries Unlucky Lady- The Sinking of HMCS Athabaskan and Cold War Love, both for the History Channel. Peter also composed for CBC's Farewell to Maple Leaf Gardens; The Olympians for CBC's coverage of the Sydney Olympics; Treehouse TV's pre-school program Crazy Quilt; and for 7 years he was Canadian Tire's corporate composer. In 1998 he began performing for CORPUS in Rendez-vous then as Flying Ace, Lutzu, in A Flock of Flyers. He has composed for CORPUS' Bridge of Sighs and their Bravo!FACT, A Flock of Flyers. In his spare time he continues work on his first symphony.
