In the 19th century, Jewish Klezmer musicians traveled eastern Europe mingling with gypsies and absorbing their musical influence. A doyne is an out-of-time, soulful piece of music embodying this influence. In Doyne Suite I imagine a village's welcome to the musicians. Under the winter night sky they dance to keep warm, to forget their hunger and for the sheer joy of life.



THE CANADIAN CHILDREN'S DANCE THEATRE is a Toronto-based modern dance troupe of sixteen young artists, aged eight to eighteen, under the artistic direction of Deborah Lundmark and Michael deConinck Smith. Established in 1980 to provide young performers and their audiences with a theatre for self-expression entertainment, the company has won wide popular and critical acclaim, and has been hailed by the Globe and Mail as "a National Treasure". The CCDT has toured Canada extensively, and in 1990 visited the People's Republic of China during its first international tour. To ensure the company's continuity and to extend the application of its principles to a larger body of young dance students, the School of the Canadian Children's Dance Theatre was established in 1983, and will continue to grow alongside the company in their new Cabbagetown home at 509 Parliament Street.

THE PETERBOROUGH COUNTY CHILDREN'S CHOIR is a program of the Peterborough County Board of Education. A total of over 120 choristers from grades 3 to 11 re involved through the Training Choir, Chamber Choir, Tourng Choir and Concert Choir, which is giving these performances. The PCCC has travelled extensively throughout Ontario and performs frequently in the Peterborough area, singing with such groups as the Peterborough Singers, Peterborough Symphony and Coventry Singers. In 1994 the choir performed for four days in the United States and theis past summer toured Europe, where it was the Canadian representative at he Bonn International Chorus in Concert Festival and also sang at Westminster Abbey and Peterborough Cathedral in England. The choir produced its first recording this year, the compact disc O Music. The PCCC will present its annual Christmas concert, Gloria, at All Saint's Church, Peterborough, on Wednesday, December 18 at 7:30 pm. Tickets are available during this performance and from the Trent University Bookstore.

# **Biographies**

**DEBORAH LUNDMARK**, Co-Artistic Director and Resident Choreographer of the Canadian Children's Dance Theatre, has created more than thirty works for that company, including collaborations with Danny Grossman, Holly Small, Toronto Children's Chorus and the Toronto Symphony Youth Orchestra. Her latest work, Six Oddities, set to Renaissance lute arrangements by Kirk Elliott, premiered at Buffalo State College during CCDT's April tour. From her Street Songs (1980) to Dancing Day (1989) and Zig Zag (1995), Ms. Lundmark has impressed audiences and critics alike with her ability to nurture young dancers' natural joy in movement without sacrificing the technical precision expected of the professional. She ranks among Canada's leading specialists in movement for the young with twenty years' experience as a ballet instructor and a supervisor of teachers-in-training both at the School of CCDT and the Ryerson theatre School.

MICHAEL DECONINCK SMITH has directed the planning and staging of over thirty CCDT productions as Co-Artistic Director and Production Manager. In 1988, he conceived and produced CCDT's acclaimed collaboration with the Toronto Boys Choir and the Hanson Singers, the original Wintersong-Dances for a Sacred Season. In 1990, Mr. deConinck Smith produced CCDT's first major international tour, to the People's Republic of China, and the following year the premiere of Songs Of Innocence And Of Experience realized one of his most cherished dreams. Mr. deConinck Smith's ongoing passion for arts advocacy has led him to join the boards of Harbourfront Centre and the Toronto Theatre Alliance.

CAROL ANDERSON has created five works for CCDT, including Nowell Sing We, Haiku, Garden, London and Sephardic Songs. Ms. Anderson had a fifteen year association with the Toronto-based modern dance company Dancemakers as a dancer, artistic director and resident choreographer. She has also pursued a wide-ranging

career as a soloist, teacher, dance consultant and independent choreographer, including recent projects for the York Dance Ensemble and guest teaching for Toronto Dance Theatre. Ms. Anderson is also known for her writings on dance, primarily her biography of Canadian dance pioneer Judy Jarvis.

DAVID BUCHBINDER is a trumpet player and composer, leader of the Flying Bulgar Klezmer Band, and artistic director Ashkenaz: a Festival of New Yiddish Culture. He has composed for the Flying Bulgars, film, television, theatre and modern dance including the score for Kim Frank's Dig. He performs in a number of jazz groups, including the Arab-Yiddish fusion quartet, Medina, and has taught at the Yiddish Folk Arts Programs KlezKamp and Buffalo on the Roof.

ARWYN CARPENTER was trained as a teacher by Deborah Lundmark. She danced with CCDT for five years and has danced in Australia and Paris, France. She has choreographed for the York University Dance Ensemble and independently for the past six years and is also the Director of CCDT's Young Apprentice Program, a training program designed to prepare young dancers for the experience of performing with the company.

KIRK ELLIOTT has composed and performed music for many Canadian dance companies, including Dancemakers, the Toronto Dance Theatre and the National Ballet of Canada. Mr. Elliott collects and plays many unusual instruments, some of which are heard in Wintersong. He has just released a new CD entitled The Heavenly Banquet, featuring harpist Erica Goodman.

KIM FRANK is a native of Montreal and a graduate of the dance program at Concordia University. Ms. Frank has worked extensively as a choreographer in theatre and has had her choreography presented at the Canada Dance Festival (Ottawa) and on the mainstage of Danceworks (Toronto). Her most recent works include Against the Meanwhile, Treehouse and a work in progress for Le

Groupe de la Place Royale. Ms. Frank was last in Peterborough in 1993 when Artspace presented her Landmines and The Bride Wore Army Boots at The Market Hall.

DONNA KRASNOW is an Associate Professor at York University, where she teaches Limon-based modern dance, improvisation, composition, repertory and kinesiology. Her distinguished background includes directing Mobius Dance Company in San Francisco, and a twenty-year performance career. Ms. Krasnow's ongoing dance science research has led to studies in neuromuscular training with Irene Dowd, as well as alternative healing methodologies and a master's degree in dance science at the University of Oregon, where she completed thesis work in dance imagery and conditioning practices. Since 1988, she has been CCDT 's company modern teacher and rehearsal director.

KATHARINE MALLINSON, CCDT's resident costume designer, is a graduate of York University's theatre arts program but also studied dance for 13 years. She has created period wedding gowns and historical costumes as well as designs for the York Dance Ensemble, the School of Toronto Dance Theatre and Dancemakers.

DAVID MORRISON has been lighting dance since 1984 and has lit over eighty world premieres, including pieces for John Alleyne, Peggy Baker, Serge Bennathan, Marie-Josee Chartier, Danny Grossman, Bill James, Allen Kaeja and James Kudelka. Most recently, Mr. Morrison designed Mark Godden's Conversation Piece for Ballet B.C., Julia Sasso's Sporting Life at the Canada Dance Festival and Le Gala des Etoiles at the Jerusalem 3000 Festival.

KATHERINE NEUFELD is a second-year student in the performance program of the Faculty of Music at the University of Toronto, studying harp with Judy Loman. A native of Peterborough, she has also studied harp with Maureen McKay and piano with Susan Taylor. This fall, she performed solo pre-performance recitals at the Toronto Symphony Young People's Concert at Roy Thompson Hall

and performed with the Toronto Symphony Youth Orchestra, the Toronto Youth Wind Orchestra and the University of Toronto Symphony Orchestra. Ms. Neufeld was a member of the original Peterborough County Board of Education Youth Choir, forerunner to the present Peterborough County Children's Choir.

BRIAN SNELL teaches instrumental music as part of a full time position with the Peterborough County Board of Education. He is also Organist and Choirmaster at All Saints' Anglican Church in Peterborough and has held similar posts in several other churches in Ontario. He has conducted choral workshops and given organ recitals throughout Ontario and in New York State and has directed the Peterborough County Childrens Choir for the past eight years.

**DIANA SMITH** was Costume Designer for the premiere performance of Wintersong in 1988 after having been introduced to the company by working for Jerrard Smith and Karen Rodd on CCDT's Simon Sorry and The Battle For The Big Toys in 1985. She has also designed costumes for productions by R. Murray Schafer, Tarragon Theatre, Theatre Passe Muraille, The Canadian Opera Company, The Judith Marcuse Dance Company and 4th Line Theatre, among others.
