BIOGRAPHIES

Kate Story is a performer and writer, born and raised in Newfoundland and living in Peterborough. She has created many solo performance works, and she also plays well with others. Upcoming look for her adaptation *Romeo and Juliet: Superstar Ice Miners of Europa!!!!* (Mysterious Entity) and a remount of *damned be this transmigration*, about writer Don Marquis. Her first novel *Blasted* (Killick Press) received the Sunburst Award's honourable mention, and she has published short fiction including "The Yoke of Inauspicious Stars" (Carbide Tipped Pens, Tor Books); "Unicorn" (Gods, Memes and Monsters, Stone Skin Press). Her story "Demoted" appears in CZP's *Imaginarium 4: The Best Canadian Speculative Writing*. Upcoming look for her work in Exile Press's collections Playground of Lost Toys and Clockwork Canada. She is this year's recipient of the Ontario Arts Foundation's K.M. Bill Brennan's expertise as a pianist, percussionist, composer and producer can be heard on some 100 albums. His album "Solo Piano 2" won the MusicNL Instrumental album of the year in 2008. In 2006 he was named the Newfoundland and Labrador Arts Council Artist of the Year. He has been musical director For Stuart McLean's *The Vinyl Cafe*. Currently, he directs the Memorial University Jazz and Gamelan Ensembles.

Ker Wells has directed works for Canadian Stage Company, NACL Theatre (NY), Cleveland Public Theatre, and many other companies and independent artists. Ker co-founded Number Eleven Theatre and Primus Theatre. He has taught at the National Theatre School and Humber College, and presently teaches theatre at Simon Fraser University.

Ryan Kerr is the artistic director of dance company Fleshy Thud and The Theatre on King, a playwright and a performer. He has also been Public Energy's Technical Director for over a decade.


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
