ARTISTS'

Sylvie Bouchard is originally from Montréal and began her training there before moving to Toronto in 1983, to study at the School of the Toronto Dance Theatre. She subsequently ioined the company in 1985 and performed nationally and internationally with them for 5 years. Sylvie has also performed with Kaeja d'Dance, Winnipeg Contemporary Dancers and Dancemakers and continues to work for many independent choreographers including Susie Burpee, Denise Fujiwara and Sashar Zarif. She was nominated for a Dora Mavor Moore award for best performance for her solo Cassiopeia, which premiered at the DuMaurier Theatre in 1999. In 1997, Sylvie Bouchard formed the company CORPUS with artistic partner David Danzon. Until 2008, she co-created and performed in 8 works through CORPUS, touring internationally. She also co-choreographed and starred in the popular children's TV Series. Four-Square, on Treehouse TV. In 1993, Bouchard created Dusk Dances, a festival that presents dance in public parks. Dusk Dances grew under the artistic direction of both Bouchard and Danzon and through the Company CORPUS, until Bouchard was appointed sole festival director in 2008. Ms. Bouchard is also the recipient of the 2009 K.M. Hunter award for dance, and is artistic director of BoucharDanse (www.bouchardanse.com), a Company that serves as an umbrella for Ms. Bouchard's artistic endeavors.

Julia Aplin is a Toronto based dance artist. Throughout her career, she has worked with many inspiring artists. She performed with Dancemakers for 15 seasons under the Artistic Direction of Serge Bennathan. She has received choreographic commissions from companies as varied as Company Blonde to the Madawaska String Quartet. Her work has been presented across Canada and in Europe. Julia's work often crosses the boundaries of genre. Recently she created the Halo Ballet choreographed for video game players in cyberspace performed with live music. She worked with actors, singers and boxers to create the new opera Voice Box. Most recently she danced, sang and played accordion in the production of Heartsong at the Arden Theatre, Alberta. As an independent artist she has performed at such venues as the Sound Symposium, Ottawa Chamber Music Festival, the AGO and the Young Centre.

As a Toronto-based choreographer/performer, **Michael Caldwell** has presented work in the dance: made in Canada Festival, Dance Ontario Weekend, Dusk Dances, Porch View Dances, and the Toronto Fringe Festival, and he has been commissioned by opera vocalist, Patricia Ruggles. He has interpreted roles for many of Canada's esteemed dance creators and companies, including Peggy Baker, Michael Greyeyes, Danny Grossman, Sasha Ivanochko, James Kudelka, Louis Laberge-Côté, Tedd Robinson, Coleman Lemieux & Compagnie, Corpus Dance Projects, Kaeja d'Dance, Kaha:wi Dance Theatre, Le Groupe Dance Lab, Zata Omm Dance Projects, among others, and has performed across Canada and the United States, in Europe, Asia, and Australia. He is a graduate of The School of Toronto Dance Theatre's Professional Training Program, and holds a bachelor's degree in film and art history from Syracuse University. He currently sits on the board of The School of Toronto Dance Theatre, is the chair of the Canadian Alliance of Dance Artists – Ontario Chapter, and is the associate curator for Older & Reckless.

Kate Franklin is a Vancouver-based contemporary dance artist who has been working with Dusk Dances since 2008. *Incandescent* is her second collaboration with Meredith Thompson. The first, *Get On Board* enjoyed a long life of touring with Dusk Dances, the Guelph Contemporary Dance Festival and the Edge of the Woods Festival. Upcoming projects include research with dance artist Justine Chambers and a new full-length program from her company firstthingsfirst productions in September 2013 (www.ftfp.ca).

Meredith Thompson is a Toronto-based independent dance artist, originally from Huntsville, Ontario. A graduate of York University (BFA/BEd, 2000), she has since enjoyed working with

BoucharDanse, Dancetheatre David Earle, the Danny Grossman Dance Company, Kaha:wi Dance Theatre, and Yvonne Ng of Princess Productions, among others. A core member of Dusk Dances, she has also been performing and touring with this popular outdoor festival since 2007. In addition, co-choreographic projects with fellow dance artists Mairéad Filgate and Kate Franklin have been presented at a number of festivals and events including Dusk Dances, the Edge of the Woods Festival, the Guelph Contemporary Dance Festival, and Up Darling. Meredith is also currently on faculty at George Brown Dance, as well as Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre.

tiger princess dance projects (tpdp) was founded by Yvonne Ng in 1995 under the umbrella of princess productions, an "art making company" and an organization that produces contemporary dance works that combines new music and theatre in an interdisciplinary approach to performance. tpdp supports Yvonne Ng's activities as a performer, choreographer, arts educator and producer and reflects her uniquely Canadian experience as an Chinese immigrant and visible minority. Since 1995, twenty-three of tpdp's works have received critical and commercial acclaim across Canada, Australia, Europe and Asia; and have garnered eight Dora Mavor Moore Award nominations for performance and choreography. tpdp's repertoire includes both Ng's own works and commissions of creations by other esteemed contemporary choreographers with similar artistic values from Canada and abroad. Toronto's most gifted dancers are involved in the creation and interpretation of the company's repertoire. tpdp is honoured to be working with Julia Aplin for this Dusk Dances 2012 commission. Dan Watson is a multiple Dora Award nominee who has created and performed and taught theatre across Canada, Scotland, France, the United States and Japan. He is Artistic Director of Edge of the Woods Theatre in Huntsville (Nuit Blanche North, Edge of the Woods Outdoor Travelling Theatre Festival, The Little G8 That Could...). He is a co-founder of the international theatre company Ahuri Theatre with who he recently conceived and directed *A Fool's Life* (6 Dora Nominations) and created *Yabu No Naka*:distruthted at the Prestigious Setagaya Public Theatre in Tokyo. Dan was also a member of Compagnie Houppz! with whom he created *SplasH20* (nominated-Eloize Prize for Outstanding Production in Eastern Francophone Canada) and *Mouving* (Eloize for Outstanding Production in Eastern Canada). He has performed with Theatre Smith Gilmour (*Grimm Too, As I Lay Dying*), Buddies in Bad Times Theatre (*Golden Thug*), Theatre Panik (*The Finger*) and FixtPoint/Theatre Passe Muraille (*4 Corners Project*). Dan is a graduate of Humber College in Toronto and École Jacques Lecoq in Paris.

William Yong was trained at the London Contemporary Dance School in England and was admitted to the Master of Arts with distinction by University of Kent. In the last year of his MA study, he was sent alone for his secondment to study with the Nederlands Dans Theatre 1 in the Netherlands. Previous dance companies he worked with included Wayne McGregor's Random Dance, Matthew Bourne's Adventures in Motion Pictures, Toronto Dance Theatre, CORPUS, Theatre Rusticle, Lina Cruz's Fila 13 and many others. William has performed in eleven dance films including his latest film *To Fly or Fall* directed by Kathi Prosser. He was also profiled in an episode of the Bravo TV documentary *Freedom* as a choreographer, interviewed and hosted by Robert Desrosiers. Currently William is the artistic director and






