

Written and performed by Deaf actor Chris Dodd, *Deafy* is a stand-up/sit-down tragicomedy blending ASL, the spoken word and surtitles which reflects on the experience of what it is like to be a Deaf person in a hearing world and leads you on an unexpected journey of what it really means to belong. *Deafy* is accessible to Deaf and non-Deaf audiences.
