to Present The Old Country Trilogy

Established in 1990, Kaeja d'Dance has become an innovative force on the Toronto dance scene. Drawing on a decade of experience as independent choreographers and professional performers, founders Allen Kaeja and Karen Resnick Kaeja have consistently presented a high standard of original, creative work. Over the next few months they are taking their company of seven dancers to Peterborough, Halifax, Vancouver and Ottawa to perform their acclaimed full evening program The Old Country Trilogy.

The Old Country Trilogy consists of three pieces created from 1993 to 1995: Sarah, a solo performed by Karen Resnick Kaeja; Blood Brothers, a duet performed by Allen Kaeja and Blake Martin; and Old Country, a sextet. All three pieces fea-

ture original music by Edgardo Moreno and are inspired by stories told to Allen Kaeja of family members who survived and perished in the Holocaust.

While in Peterborough, Allen and Karen will be teaching their specialty dance style, contact dance, in local schools for three days prior to the performance. Known throughout Canada as innovative practitioners of Contact Dance, Allen and Karen were appointed by the National Ballet School as the first guest artists to teach this discipline. They will give a public workshop in Contact Dance on March 31 at 1 pm at St. John's Anglican Church, 99 Brock St.

Peterborough New Dance is a nationally recognized animator of dance and movement-based performance. They present public performances and other community based activities including residencies, workshops, lectures and collaborations between local and visiting artists. On its own and as a founding member

of Candance, Canada's national network of dance presenters, Peterborough New Dance had premiered and commissioned work from some of the country's most innovative choreographers.

Upcoming performances in March are: EMERGENCY #4, March 7, 8, 9, 10 Fourth annual festival of new dance and performance featuring artists from Peterborough. The participants include Marsh Cobden, Emma Jack, Kristine Keating, Davis Mirza, Penelope Thomas, and scooter, as well as collaborations by Anne Ryan/Esther Vincent, and Judy Dixon/Tom Schroeter.
