Originally produced by Artspace in 1992 and 1993, to specifically encourage local emerging artists (hence the name) working in dance and performance, Emergency proved to be such a good breeding ground for new talent that its mandate now is to present new work by established artists, as well as those artists just starting out. The name stuck because, after all, Peterborough artists are almost always working under emergency-like conditions.

One indication that Emergency has been something of a success is not just its longevity, but also the fact that a few local dance artists have been noticed elsewhere. As evidence, we present an excerpt from an unfinished piece by Toronto-based Meagan O'Shea, danced by our own scooter.

For the 2000 edition, Emergency returned to its roots, involving Artspace as cosponsor and inviting submissions that blurred the lines between dance, performance and performance art. The result is a program of nine premieres that encompass visual art, design, original music, text, and oh yes, some good old dance. Enjoy!

Biographies

Libby Dalrymple performed and choreographed *Baggage* in Emergency #7 with Jessica Tudos. Classically trained in ballet and jazz, she uncovered a passion for Latin rhythms and movement while living in Colombia. She has played various roles in full length plays and musical theatre, including Theatre Cambrian's "Grease". Libby's current life "role" is teaching at Lakefield College School. She is also active in an a cappella choral group and as a Nordic ski patroller.

Dy Gallagher is well known for her work with Serious Contact Artist Group (*Pent*, 1996), random lessons on the two-step, and choreographic collaborations with writers, including Brian Mitolo and Phillip Kummel, whose *Protruberant Metal Test* she helped create in the very first Emergency.

Anne Ryan has a B.F.A. in dance from York University, has appeared in nearly every Emergency (often dancing in more than one piece, as she did the first year), and has produced two full programs of her own work: *Two Bodies* ('98) and *Meaningful Eye Contact* ('97). For Emergency #7 she created the trio *Fallen*.

Kate Story, writer and performer, has created a number of successful solo works and performed them in Peterborough, Toronto and St. John's (land of her birth), including *Crazy...Crazy Like A Fish*, which debuted at EMERGENCY #7.

Penelope Thomas recently worked as choreographer for the Black Well Theatre Company production of *Goodnight Desdemona*, *Good Morning Juliet* at Gordon Best Theatre. In October 1999, Peterborough New Dance presented her solo *Interstices* (which premiered at Emergency #6) in its mainstage series. *Second Wind* is her third work for Emergency.

Jessica Tudos performed and choreographed Baggage in Emergency #7 with Libby Dalrymple. Jessica's physical expression started in the playpen, where she would stand on her head for hours. This led to a 12 year career in artistic gymnastics, a highlight being LA '84. She has since focussed on education, cultural exchange and fostering experiential learning in a variety of international locales. Currently at Trent recruiting international students, Jessica is also active in the expressive arts community and hopes to continue creatively collaborating.
